Since opening its first school in 1988 serving 25 students, Seeds of Health, Inc. has progressively expanded its educational services. Seeds of Health currently serves approximately 1,300 students and has the only K-12 charter school system in the State of Wisconsin. Seeds of Health, Inc. operates its schools through partnership and charter agreements with the Milwaukee Public Schools and the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee, and the WIC Program through the Department of Health and Family Services.

### MISSION

The Seeds of Health, Inc. mission is to address the health and educational needs of Milwaukee-area women, adolescents, and children by providing nutritional counseling and focused educational programs to urban populations.

## HISTORY



Seeds of Health, Inc. was incorporated in 1983 as a 501(c)(3) non-stock corporation designed to address the health and educational needs of Milwaukee-area women, adolescents and children. The programs operating under the Seeds of Health, Inc. umbrella include a Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) Program and five schools, one K4-8 elementary school and four high schools, each with a distinct mission. Seeds of Health, Inc. operates its schools through partnership and charter agreements with Milwaukee Public Schools and the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee, and the WIC Program through the Department of Health and Family Services. Seeds of Health is governed by a seven member volunteer board of directors and currently employs 120 staff members.

### How did we get started in the school business?

Beginning in 1983 under its WIC program, Seeds of Health has worked to promote and maintain the health and well-being of high risk pregnant women including school-age parents. In serving these girls, we found that many of them dropped out of school or were intending to withdraw from school. In seeing this need, we submitted a proposal to MPS under the children-at-risk statute and were successful in obtaining a contract to open a school for 25 school-age parents.

Because of our commitment to meeting the needs of urban children over the past 30 years, Seeds of Health opened five additional schools to meet the diverse needs of the children of Milwaukee. These choices provide urban children with educational opportunities in small, creative environments based on strong and positive relationships. From a small beginning of 25 students, Seeds of Health has grown to provide educational services to approximately 1,300 students in the only K-12 charter school system in the State of Wisconsin.

Current programs of Seeds of Health include:

**The WIC Program** helps approximately 3,000 clients at up to 185% poverty including pregnant women, new mothers and young children up to age five eat well, learn about nutrition, and stay healthy.

**Grandview High School** was established in 1987 as an alternative high school under the children at-risk statute. Grandview is in a partnership agreement with Milwaukee Public Schools and currently serves 230 at-risk students in grades 9-12.

**Seeds of Health Elementary,** which includes Windlake Elementary (grades K4-3) and Windlake Academy (grades 4-8), was established in 1996 and serves 454 students in grades K4 through 8. Seeds of Health Elementary School is authorized by the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee as a 2r charter school.

**Veritas High School** was established in 2001 as a college preparatory high school and serves 251 students in grades 9-12. Veritas High School is authorized by the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee as a 2r charter school.

**Tenor High School** is a 2r charter school chartered through the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee and serves 248 students. Established in 2005, Tenor provides students with an opportunity to complete four years of high school in three years and receive one free year of college education at Milwaukee Area Technical College (MATC) in their 4th year.

**Milwaukee Community Cyber High School (MC<sup>2</sup>)** opened in 2010 as the first blended learning high school in the City of Milwaukee and currently serves 190 students in grades 9-12. MC<sup>2</sup> is authorized by Milwaukee Public Schools as a non-instrumentality charter school.

### The success of Seeds of Health, Inc. is highlighted by the following:

- Over thirty years' experience managing a successful nonprofit agency.
- A demonstrated disposition to proactively improve educational opportunities for urban children.
- A coordinated K-12 system administration structure that is experienced in managing multiple school sites and programs.
- Twenty-eight years of experience in progressively developing effective and sustainable educational programs that are validated by ongoing external reviews, full enrollments, and wait list subscriptions.
- An established record of responsible fiscal management recognized by continuous audits, compliance with contracts, and recommendations from chartering agents for five year contract renewals.

### The success of Seeds of Health programs is highlighted by the following:

- The WIC Program continues to be recognized by the Department of Health and Family Services as a model program with exceptional outcomes related to reducing infant mortality and promoting healthier lifestyles for its participants resulting in healthy babies and children.
- 2r charter schools have been designated high performing schools as defined by attendance, graduation rate, state standardized test results, and growth in Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) assessment, and meet expectations on the Wisconsin State Report Card.
- Consistently exceeds Milwaukee Public School's test scores and exceeds or meets state scores in tested areas.
- Consistent student growth on the Measures of Academic Progress (MAP), and tests scores regularly meet the national norms.
- Graduation rate consistently exceeds 95%
- 2r charter schools continue to earn five year charter contract renewals from the University of Wisconsin Board of Regents.
- Regular renewal of the at-risk contract with Milwaukee Public Schools.

The Seeds of Health vision is to positively impact the growth and development of urban children. Over the past thirty years, Seeds of Health, Inc. has acted on that vision through the successful implementation of quality, focused programs that provide the best possible opportunities for children to thrive physically, emotionally, socially and educationally. Through innovative programs, vigorous accountability standards, and detailed fiscal management, Seeds of Health will continue to meet the needs of our community.

Our students come to us behind in credits due to a variety of reasons. Because we offer a credit-recovery program by blending traditional classes with online classes, our students are able to catch up in both skills and credits. Our rigorous curriculum meets all expected MPS and state standards which

In order to ensure that our students are making progress, we use MAP tests to regularly assess their growth and design our classes to meet their specific needs. Windlake opened in 1996 and is a public 2r charter school authorized by the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee. The Windlake Elementary School campus (2433 South 15th Street)





serves students in grades K4-3, and Windlake Academy (1445 South 32nd Street) is the 4th-8th grade campus.

Our caring, empathetic staff works to address every child's needs taking into account each child's specific interests, learning style and talents. Windlake's highly trained and state certified teachers provide well-rounded instruction in reading, math, language arts, science, social studies, physical education and music. Students use a variety of technology every day to enhance their learning experience. We are a Project Lead the Way (PLTW) school offering hands-on science, technology, engineering and math instruction. In addition, the curriculum focuses on social and emotional development as well as the skills needed to prepare students for lifelong learning. Windlake's staff specializes in providing the unique, fundamental support necessary for children living in an urban environment.

Windlake believes that ongoing communication and partnerships with all families is essential for successful learning. In addition to regularly scheduled parent-teacher conferences, parents are encouraged to participate in classroom activities, field trips and a variety of parenting classes offered throughout the school year.

#### MISSION

The Windlake mission is to work in strong partnership with parents and community to fully develop the physical, emotional, social and intellectual potential of each child in a safe and supportive learning environment.

#### PROGRAM

Windlake provides well-rounded instruction in reading, math, language arts, science, social studies, physical education and music, preparing students for lifelong learning. School programs, such as PLTW and RTI provide a well-rounded source of support for all students. ### A MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL, TYSON TLACHAC

Tenor High School is a public 2r charter school authorized by the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee. The only school of its kind in Milwaukee, Tenor opened in 2005 to provide students with an opportunity to complete four years of high school in three years. Successful students then receive one free year of college education at Milwaukee Area Technical College during their senior year. Tenor's staff provides individual guidance and mentoring that makes each student's transition to college successful. Many of our students continue at MATC to complete an Associate's Degree while others have chosen to take the credits they've earned while at MATC to pursue a Bachelor's Degree at a four year college or university.

Recognizing that citizenship and social skills are essential to career success, Tenor insists on regular attendance, class participation, and a strong adherence to rules and regulations, including a dress code requirement. Tenor prepares students with a rigorous curriculum in a safe and engaging environment. Small class sizes, dedicated teachers and administrators, and school-sponsored activities allow students to build communication, leadership, teamwork and decision-making skills, giving them many opportunities to experience both academic and personal success.

### MISSION

The Tenor High School mission is to prepare Milwaukee students for successful entry to post-secondary education and career opportunities through the dual completion of a high school diploma and a Milwaukee Area Technical College program certificate and/or credits in a post-secondary degree program.

### PROGRAM

Tenor is Wisconsin's only dual-certification high school program which includes a free year of college at MATC. As a high-performing school, Tenor provides students with a comprehensive high school program including a rigorous curriculum, summer school classes, WIAA and club athletics, extra-curricular activities, and a full time school counselor and special education teacher. In addition, Tenor is a certified Project Lead the Way school. The teaching staff is Wisconsin certified and licensed and continues to have a retention rate of over 90%. Tenor High School is tuition free.

**2R** "2r" charter schools in the State of Wisconsin are "independent" charter schools, to indicate that no school board is involved in their establishment. The Common Council of the City of Milwaukee, the chancellor of UWM, the chancellor of UW-Parkside, and the MATC district board may establish and operate a charter school under this designation.

**CHARTER SCHOOL** A publicly funded independent school established by teachers, parents, or community groups under the terms of a charter with a local or national authority

**DPI** Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction is the state agency that advances public education and libraries in Wisconsin and provides supervision for the state's public school districts.

**DPI AWARDS** The Wisconsin Title I Schools of Recognition awards highlight schools that have demonstrated success in educating students from low-income families. To qualify, schools must receive federal Title I funding to provide services to large numbers or high percentages of economically disadvantaged children and meet other achievement criteria.

**PLTW** Project Lead the Way is a nationally recognized program that prepares students to be innovative and productive leaders in science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM). PLTW encourages the development of problem-solving skills, critical thinking, creative innovative reasoning, and a love of learning.

**RTI** Response to Intervention is a process that provides intervention and educational support to all students at increasing levels of intensity based on individual needs. The goal is to prevent problems and intervene early so that students can be successful.

**STATE REPORT CARDS** Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction (DPI) produces report cards for every district and school in Wisconsin. These Report Cards provide data on multiple indicators for four Priority Areas: Student Achievement, Student Growth, Closing Gaps, and On-track and Postsecondary Readiness.

Performance on three Student Engagement Indicators is also reported. These three indicators affect student success and school effectiveness: Test Participation Rate, Absenteeism Rate, and Dropout Rate.

A district's or school's Overall Accountability Score places the district or school into one of five Overall Accountability Ratings: Significantly Exceeds Expectations, Exceeds Expectations, Meets Expectations, Meets Few Expectations, and Fails to Meet Expectations.
